1256 MOVEMENT FOUNDERS MOVE TO NORTH TULSA

Greg and Jill Taylor wanted to be in closer proximity with the ongoing mission of 1256. For example, three roofs that were replaced in 2024 with your donations to 1256 were within two miles of the Taylor’s home. Greg and Jill restored a home built in 1920, and Greg said “I now understand many more of the old home problems that our neighbors face and that we address with 1256 funds to homeowners.”

25 BLACK OWNED HOMES IMPACTED BY DONATIONS

Since 2020, \$233,405 has been donated to 1256 Movement. From these donations, \$198,382 has been conveyed in the form of restoration of 25 Black owned homes, and the current bank balance is 35,023. The work includes roofing, ADA bathrooms, security doors, and fire restoration in order to rehab a home. We work personally with homeowners and pay contractors directly after the homeowner is satisfied. Our strategic vision is to raise \$480,000 in 2025 and scale this process to be more efficient and impact 48 homes in 2025.
